

**A BRIEF HISTORY OF CHRISTIAN SANDY
TAILORING INSTRUCTOR
KABOR PROJECT**



Christian graduated from High School during the 70s. Before leaving School, he had already sat and passed the Sierra Leone civil Service entrance Exams. This enabled him to gain employment in the Sierra Leone Civil Service. He worked as an accounts clerk for eight years, during this period he took the G.C.E O'Level exams successfully. He entered the university of Sierra Leone – Fourah Bay College in the mid eighties (80s). Unfortunately he dropped out due to severe illness. Gaining back his health after two years, he stayed home and couldn't continue his course because of no sponsorship.

During the war period, he went to the republic of Guinea as a refugee. Whilst in Guinea, he was engaged in commercial Tailoring, which was an art he learnt when he was a School boy. In returning to Sierra Leone, just after the end of the war, he continued practicing commercial Tailoring. It was during this exercise that he made a decision to

work for the Kabor Project to contribute in empowering young and vulnerable girls.
