

Working together to find positive progressions for young people in London

The action team have spent the last few months supporting asphaleia training in West London with the P2P project.

This project provides job skills development, as well as positive activities and support, for young people across London who are not in education, employment or training.



“The action team have been in contact with more than 40 employers, over 15 schools, and many colleges spanning five Boroughs, whilst supporting the P2P project,” explains Dave Cottrell, CEO. “It has been a real learning experience for the team, as their focus in the past has been mainly asylum seeking or migrant children. This has been their first attempt at working with young people struggling to find work or success at school – and they have done a fantastic job!”

In March alone the P2P team saw five young people go to work in McDonalds and one in a local pub. Earlier this year they saw a young person get a job at Heathrow Airport, with the promise of a performance based promotion within one year.

“We are now even more excited for the Better Life project to start, so we can widen our impact once again!” concludes Dave.
